Standing Together & Speaking Up

The Yorktown community and our local schools have been busy over the last few months. Thousands of students walked out of their classrooms Wednesday, March 14 to raise awareness about the impact of gun violence on our schools. Many in our community also participated in spirited and mostly civil discussions on the social media app "Nextdoor."

County Board Member Libby Garvey was our guest speaker for our Yorktown Civic Association meeting on May 2. Ms. Garvey talked about issues related to the recently passed county budget and addressed various concerns. She also talked about the tough choices that had to be made to stay within the self-imposed county budget targets.

Fortunately, the county board decided to fully fund the Lee Highway Alliance (LHA) and the Lee Highway planning initiative. Yorktown

area home owners and businesses are encouraged to stay engaged with the Lee Highway planning and revitalization process. Visit the LHA website www.leehighwayalliance.com for more information.

The Arlington Public School Board proposed to change Nottingham Elementary School from a neighborhood school to a choice school.

After a sustained engagement from Nottingham parents, the YCA Traffic Safety Committee, and the Yorktown community, APS decided to keep Nottingham a neighborhood school. A big win for our community! A great example of the power of citizen engagement.

Also on our radar screen has been the continued student enrollment

growth at Yorktown High School. I sent a letter to the School Board and the County Board in October 2016 stating our opposition to the proposed "boundary refinement" plans. In the fall of 2017, APS implemented the boundary changes adding more students to the already crowded Yorktown High School. On May 6, 2018, I sent another letter to the County Board opposing the building modification use permit on the grounds that the increased enrollment would exacerbate an already unacceptable traffic and parking situation. I also voiced our concerns at the County Board meeting on May 22, 2018.

Children's School Being Built Soon in Alpine Space ...

On March 1st, YCA attended a community meeting facilitated by the Lee Highway Alliance (LHA) with the GlebeWood Civic Association to give stakeholders an opportunity to discuss issues surrounding The Children's School's (TCS) move to a permanent site. TCS is a private day care facility, which provides day care for Arlington school teachers' children and is subsidized by Arlington Public Schools.

After a two-year search, TCS has agreed to a lease with the owners of the Alpine Restaurant site on Lee Highway. TCS is proposing a by-right redevelopment and requesting a use

permit for a 3-story day care facility with underground parking.

As an outcome of the meeting, a list of community concerns went to the applicant's land use attorney, to address at a subsequent meeting. They include: 1) traffic access and curb cuts, 2) building set back and design, 3) sidewalk width & streetscape, 4) trash location and collection, 5) lighting and signage design, 6) community pedestrian access through site to Lee, 7) use of facilities for community meetings or events, and 8) schedule of public approvals and construction. Additional items include details on the green / planter space and stormwater area.

YCA is attempting to obtain the use permit details and outcome of the subsequent meeting and will post those on the YCA website for comment. Feel free to contact the YCA Executive Committee with your thoughts and concerns as well so we can pass them onto the LHA for action.





Where Does Yorktown Begin, and End? A Boundary Map ...



The Yorktown Civic Association represents the community shown in the map at right — residents living in north Arlington, Virginia, bound by Lee Highway on the south, Old Dominion Dr./Columbus St. to the east, Little Falls Rd./Rock Spring Rd. on the north, and N. Jefferson St. to the west.

These boundaries are drawn and agreed upon by Arlington County, in conjunction with the civic associations, and have been in place for quite some time.

Meetings tend to focus on issues that affect residents inside the boundary lines, and where our boundaries intersect with other associations (especially around school boundary maps and transportation).
